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# APPLIED PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Project management is a growing field and there is an increased demand for individuals to know about, and manage, both small- and large-scale projects. The Applied Project Management Certificate (APMC) program will take students through the lifecycle of a project, providing the terminology and concepts required to participate in, and lead, projects. The courses will go through the planning, cost estimates and budgeting, communication strategies for stakeholders, and monitoring and controlling projects. The program is for individuals wanting to augment their education and gain the foundational knowledge and skills needed in project management or wanting to step into project management.
