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# EDUCATION ASSISTANT DIPLOMA PROGRAM

Since its inception in 1987, the Educational Assistant Diploma program had provided innovative and valuable training to educational assistants in our school system. Through this program, you will gain both the theoretical and practical knowledge you need to become confident and effective presence in the classroom. The program focuses on the role of the educational assistant within the learning system and provides a practical understanding of exceptional children and how to help them.

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## Getting Started

Submit completed application form along with supporting documentation including completion of Canadian Grade 12 (or equivalent) **OR** Post-secondary transcripts (90 hours required for admission if Canadian Grade 12 not held).

Applicants whose first language is not English must submit a current language assessment completed within the last two years

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## Objectives

- A through understanding of the school system and current education and school law issues
- A practical understanding of exceptional children and how to help them
- Knowledge about language development, human development and how students learn

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## Outcomes

Upon completion of this program, students should be able to:

- incorporate individual learning styles into the classroom
- apply learning disability remediation
- apply math reading and writing remediation \*
- appropriately observe and record student behavior and apply behavior management techniques.
